Metallic Braid Jewelry

Requirements:

DFN metallic floss in your choice of color jewelry clasps



Instructions:


To make a length of metallic braid to be used as jewelry, decide on the length needed, and double it...or quadruple it for a thicker braid.

For an 11" anklet (along one) as shown use a 24" length of floss. First slip one half of your jewelry clasp onto the floss. Bring to the middle and fold the floss in half at that point. (See A). Tape (or pin) this end to your workspace. Slip the other half of the jewelry clasp over BOTH ends of the floss (See B). Now 22" (or double the desired length) out from the taped end, tie the two ends in a knot leaving the excess length which you'll need in a minute. Position the loose clasp part exactly halfway

up the length of the floss (See C)

Carefully begin to twist the length...adjusting the clasp to remain at the halfway point. When the length of floss is completely twisted take the midway clasp in one hand. Keeping tension, bring the loose end to the taped end. KNOT to CLASP. (See D) Remove from the workspace, give a firm shake, and voila! a twist braid. Now... using the loose ends, carefully and as neatly as possible tie the loose end to the clasp The other side will already have a clasp neatly in place.
